### **Campbellford Celebrates the Completion of Waterfront Development Project – Phase 1**

**CAMPBELLFORD** – The Municipality of Trent Hills today officially opened the first phase of the Campbellford Waterfront Development Project, which offers a riverwalk with decorative lighting and benches, landscaping, interpretative signage and docking for the enjoyment of residents, tourists and boaters of the Trent Severn Waterway. Rick Norlock, MP for Northumberland–Quinte West; Lou Rinaldi, MPP for Northumberland; and Hector Macmillan, Mayor of the Municipality of Trent Hills, joined the Campbellford Waterfront Development Committee to celebrate the launch of this important Canada–Ontario Infrastructure Project (COIP).

The Government of Canada and the Government of Ontario each committed up to \$465,000 in support of a series of infrastructure projects, including the Campbellford Waterfront Development Project, across the Municipality of Trent Hills under COIP. The municipality and its partners committed the balance of the eligible costs of \$2,325,000.

“The Campbellford Waterfront Development will be a central attraction for visitors and residents, now and for generations to come,” said Mr. Norlock. “Canada’s new government is pleased to support this project that builds the type of vibrant community that Ontarians deserve and expect.”

“Visitors will love spending time along Campbellford’s new, picturesque riverwalk,” said Mr. Rinaldi. “The Ontario government is pleased to support the Campbellford Waterfront Development Project, which will help boost tourism and improve the quality of life in the community.”

“The redevelopment of Campbellford’s waterfront has become a project of major importance for the benefit of local residents, businesses, and tourists,” remarked Trent Hills Mayor Hector Macmillan, “The Municipality of Trent Hills is committed to the Campbellford Waterfront Development Project and I am pleased to announce Council has recently approved \$85,000 from the Municipal Fund of the Campbellford-Seymour Community Foundation for the construction of Phase 2.”
